

# Science Educator, Planetarium

As a prominent part of the visitor's Museum experience, Planetarium staff must be able to deliver a compelling, scientifically accurate program, and connect with visitors of all ages and backgrounds. About half of all public visitors to the Hudson River Museum visit the Planetarium.

Immediate openings for 2 part-time Educators are available. Science Educators report to the Manager of Planetarium and Science Programs.

## **Key Responsibilities**

Planetarium:

- Operate star projector and planetarium theatre computer system
- Present one 45-minute live-lecture star show per weekend day for the public
- Present two 25-45 minute pre-recorded shows per weekend day for the public
- Field questions and perform demonstrations as part of the planetarium programs
- Present shows for schools on weekdays on an as-needed basis, in lieu of Museum staff
- Maintain up-to-date knowledge of current sky events and objects, and new developments in astronomy and space science

Public Programs and Outreach:

- Staff outreach events at schools, public parks, festivals, and other venues
- Assist with public events at museum on weekends, facilitating science projects

- Available on an as-needed basis for weekday school shows and evening programs
